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"Go into all the world and preach the gospel to the whole creation." (Mk 16:15) is the missionary commandment of Jesus to the whole Church. As being members of the church, the first duty of the religious is to make visible the marvels wrought by God in the frail humanity. For religious are required to be men and women of hope springing from their absolute conviction that they are loved by good, loving and merciful God. This faith will make them joyful witnesses of good news. God can bring happiness and authentic fraternities will increase our joy. According to Pope Francis, every Christians by their nature are joyful because they are set free from sin, sorrow, from their emptiness and loneliness. And our joy attracts other people to Christ. And this gift of joy must be nourished by a life of prayer, meditation on the word of God, the celebration of sacraments and life in the community. All of the religious should be content and satisfied, for a gloomy disciple is a disciple of gloom. Like everyone we have our troubles, our nights of soul etc. but in these, one must find perfect joy as St. Francis could.

Religious life is a prophetic call to be a joyful witness to the world. Even in the midst of the obvious hurt, confusion and even despair among our brothers and sisters, we can be a people of hope. As Thomas of Celano remarks, Francis constantly endeavored to persevere in this gladness of heart, to keep ever fresh the unction of the spirit and the oil

of joy. With utmost solicitude he avoided the greatest evil of ill humour. With imperturbable tranquility and cheerfulness of mind he sang, to himself and to God songs of joy in his heart. His ceaseless effort was to keep himself interiorly and exteriorly in a joyous mood. Francis impressed the same character of joy on his order. The primitive Franciscan days were as a single melody full of spiritual joy. The object of their apostolic activity was to promote and encourage true joy among the masses by words, songs and example. For even on the death bed he declared, 'For what else are the friars but joyous minstrels of the Lord who move and excite the hearts of listeners to spiritual joy?' Franciscan Joy is the joy in God, of God and from God. For Francis, sadness was real spiritual anemia, an indication of lukewarmness and laxity. "A servant of God, a person who is committed to God, should persevere in joy, but should he lose it, let him have recourse to prayer and regain it" (II Cel. 125).

However, Francis did not consider all joy to be healthy. Joy that results from vain glory that manifests itself in idle words and excites laughter was as tasteless to him as sadness itself. The perfect joy that he taught his disciples was to be derived from complete renouncement of those transitory things which take away the attention of man from the love of God. Francis rejoiced unceasingly in the Lord because they did not have anything by which they could have been grieving in any way. While addressing the Latin American religious in 2021 Pope Francis said "It is so sad to see consecrated men and women who have no sense of humor, who take everything seriously." And he continued "Please, to be with Jesus is to be joyful."

The first and best way to maintain our joy and to spread hope to others, is to encounter Jesus. In his apostolic exhortation, "The Joy of the Gospel" ("Evangelii Gaudium") Pope Francis invites all Christians to have a renewed personal encounter with Jesus, or at least

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an openness to letting Him encounter them (No.3). This encounter with Jesus will change us, just as it did for Mathew the tax collector, Mary Magdalene, Zaccheus and so many more. Jesus didn't allow them to let their sinful pasts hold them back. The sinful situation becomes an opportunity to experience the mercy of Jesus. Thus they were filled with joy.

Now the question is, how to encounter our Lord? Two basic ways to encounter Him as per the long-standing tradition in the Church: Word and Sacrament. The first step in getting to know Christ is through the Scriptures and it begins by starting to read the Gospels. Unless we have a clear picture about Jesus in the scriptures whatever we do becomes out of focus. As religious, and especially as Capuchins, our charism is to follow Jesus in the gospels. The second means to encounter Jesus is by the celebration of the sacraments. In everyday Eucharist celebrations we commemorate the kenosis of Jesus out of his love for humanity. We are spiritually united with him by these celebrations of the sacraments. The grace which sacraments bring will enable us to continue the sacrificial life of Jesus through our own life.

After encountering Jesus by both these means, our next step is to transform the world we come in contact with. Once we experience the love of God for us, we can't but spread the joy. We ought to radiate the mercy which we got from God. As Christians we are called to proclaim the good news through our words and life. We are all commissioned by our Lord to go to every corner of the earth, to bring the Good News of salvation through Christ. Only if our witness is joyful will we attract men and women to Christ. Christianity spreads through the joy of disciples who know that they are loved and saved. This joy is just the same that the prodigal son experienced. We can no longer be rigid and merciless to those who have failed to do their duties and those who have gone wrong.

Once we experience God's forgiveness, we will be filled with joy, a joy which the world can't give us. This was the experience of St. Francis. After his encounter with Jesus on San Damiano Cross, he was sure that his sins were forgiven, and hence was filled Joy and started singing songs aloud. Our communities must radiate this Franciscan joy around and among the people we come into contact.

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May our witness be a joyful witness, day in, day out!

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A brief Report of the Extraordinary Provincial Chapter held at Assisi Ashram Bharananganam, from 24th to 26th February 2022.

Introduction

Our Ordinary Election Chapter was due in 2020, which could not be conducted due to the COVID pandemic, with its devastating after effects. Hence, after a due consultation of the brothers of the province, Br. General Minister, with his council, appointed as provincial, Br. George Antony Assaricheril and his counselors to animate and administer the province for the current triennium. However, the Provincial Council was asked to hold an extra ordinary chapter as early as possible to present the administrative and the financial report of the province as well as to discuss in common the various programs and projects to animate the province for the triennium 2020 to 2023. In compliance with the demand of the General Minister and his council, an extra ordinary provincial chapter was convoked by the provincial minister and his counselors to be conducted from 24th to 26th, February 2022. Here below you can read a brief report of the extraordinary chapter held at Assisi renewal center Bharanaganam from 24th to 26th February 2020.

Due to the prevailing conditions of restrictions and controls, by the civil authorities, the living together of the brothers to celebrate their fraternity and to share their achievements and failures and future plan of reliving the Franciscan capuchin Charism in the province, the chapter days were shortened and the participants were dispensed from staving together at one place for the celebration of the triennial fraternal gathering. Therefore, the timetable was made in such a way that the brothers from the nearby fraternities could arrive for the chapter from their own respective residences and depart in time to reach back to their homes in time, not too late. As a consequence, the hours were spent together in the chapter were drastically reduced. But we followed, in the given time, all the necessary formalities to be gone through during a provincial chapter. And nothing was thereby compromised. All the brothers of the province can feel happy that they, with their goodwill and spirit of sacrifice and collaboration could dare any adverse circumstances that might seem to paralyze their life and ministry in the province.

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First Day (24/2/2022)

The inauguration of the proceedings of the chapter:

All the participants arrived at the venue of the chapter in time. And we began the inaugural ceremonies of the chapter exactly at 9:30am, with a beautiful and inspiring prayer service, conducted by the liturgical committee designated for the chapter under the leadership of Br Anish Elampurayidathil. The prayer service was followed by the first session of the chapter, which consisted of going through the formalities of the chapter, such as approval of the timetable, appointing the chapter secretary and the other officials of the chapter like steering committee, moderators, recording secretaries, drafting committee, liturgical committee, etc. and the approval of the prepared agenda.

Having completed the formalities, Br. Provincial Minister proceeded to the inaugural address. He welcomed and thanked all the participants and said "Brothers, you took the risk of coming here because you believe in fraternity, in the coming together, there is joy on all the faces of the friars". Then, he continued to express his gratitude to all the brothers for having placed their trust in the new provincial minister and his counselors by choosing them by their consultative vote conducted by the general administration. He also requested their fraternal cooperation and prayerful support of all in the administration and revitalization of the province, which is to some extent, suffering from various ailments, especially in the areas of fidelity to Franciscan Capuchin fraternal spirit, poverty, simplicity and other typical Franciscan values. It is high time that we as a group of generous and committed brothers follow the Poverello of Assisi with greater enthusiasm and genuine endeavors to rededicate ourselves so that the Franciscan spirit can rebuild the church of the modern times as it did at the time of its founding father. Saint Francis of Assisi. God has already manifested His Holy Will by giving the universal church an erudite and capable Jesuit Cardinal Bergoglio as the Pope filled with the Franciscan spirit and enthusiasm to propagate the genuine Franciscan values by simplicity, universal brotherhood and peace in every levels of the society. The Pope's messages are a constant challenge to all the members of the Franciscan family to recapture and to live concretely, the Franciscan values. Then the provincial minister proceeded to welcome Br Joseph Puthenpurkacal and Br. Mathew Vattakunnel to present the triennial provincial and financial report respectively. Then he welcomed also the brothers who represented the different areas of their missionary and pastoral activities who were present in the chapter

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to give a very brief account of their presence and ministry in their respective territories.

Br Ricky Mukhim (Assam) Br Manish (P N G) Br.Varghese Pulickiyil (Namibia) Br. Mathew Paikada (Syro-Malabar mission outside of Kerala), Br. Cherian Scaria (AP, Vijnananilayam Eluru) gave a clearer picture of what was happening and how the brothers were living and spreading the Franciscan values in the various parts of our country and abroad. It was indeed very encouraging to the brothers to know that many wonderful things are happening in the world through the grace of God and the collaboration of our own brothers. Then the provincial concluded his welcome address by extending a special welcome to our Br Kristudas, who was not attending the previous provincial chapters, the brothers who attended the provincial chapter for the first time and the veterans who have participated in several chapters in their lifetime. The conclusion of the inaugural address was followed by the lighting of the lamb as a sign of the presence of the risen Lord, and that of the Holy Spirit amidst the capitulars throughout the Chapter days. With this the first session of the chapter was concluded, and all went for a light refreshment, and relaxation.

The second session began at 11:15am. Br Renny Velayapallil, the Custos of the Nirmalamatha custody of Assam -Meghalaya was asked by the chapter Secretary Br. Amal Keeprath to preside over this session. The session started with the presentation of the triennial report by Br Joseph Puthenpurackal, the previous provincial minister. In addition to the prepared and distributed triennial report, he added the following points: Br. Jinto Puthenpurackal was pursuing the pastoral instead of spiritual theology course. Br. Sibychen Puthiyidom has been appointed as the auditor in the tribunal of the Archdiocese of Changanassery as well as the vice postulator of the cause of the beatification of Puthenparambil Thommachan, the pioneer and the promoter or the Franciscan third order in the Syro Malabar Church in Kerala.

The moderator then proceeded to take up the point of clarifications and responses to the triennial report. The capitulars took a keen interest in proposing their views on the report presented and made their own suggestions. Some of the points that came up are: the need of language correction; the reason for the change of name FAAC to "Atma Mitra"; regarding the origin and presence of YOU-FRA in Gethsemany Ashram; need of consistency in mentioning the

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expenses incurred for the repair of the houses, the present status of the contract between St.Joseph Province and Marymatha province of Andhra/Telengana/Odisha. Appreciating the financial stability of the province achieved during the last triennium etc. were the salient points by way of response to the report.

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The afternoon session started at 2:30 p.m. with the financial report of the triennium presented by Br Matthew Vattakunnel, the previous procurator. After a few clarifications on the report Br. George Antony, the provincial minister gave a picture of the financial situation during the time of COVID pandemic. Real brotherliness, he noted, was shown at this time of crisis. Insurance claims, keeping the COVID affected brothers in the Quarantine, and the related issues were big problems to be carefully handled. The gathering of the Guardians, the program of Fratelli Vicini get-together, etc. helped in pooling the ideas and tackling the situations smoothly. It was our genuine spirit of Capuchin fraternity that saved us he said. He gratefully recalled the financial support the fraternities of Mannamthala, Uzhavoor and PNG mission extended to us during the period of crisis. He specially thanked his predecessor Br Joseph Puthenpurackal for stabilizing the financial situation of the province by putting it on a strong foundation. The insurance policies helped the province in a big way in handling the huge medical expenses. He finally suggested the idea of conservation, that is, carefully planning of financial management as the income has been reduced in recent years. Having concluded his observations, he invited Br. Sandeep Neendisserv, the present provincial procurator to present the financial situation of the province from the month of July 2020. Br. Sandeep gave a clear and detailed account of the present financial condition of the province with a Power Point presentation of the data.

Having completed the discussions and the clarifications on the financial report, the chapter proceeded to take the points in the agenda for discussion. The Moderator Renny Velayapallil requested the capitulars to postpone the discussion on our missions to the next day, as some missionaries would be joining the chapter only from that day. It was accepted by all. Then the points given in the agenda were taken up for discussion. The first point that came up was community and Prayer Life of the brothers. Since this point has been discussed in the previous chapters also, it was meant as a renewed reminder to pay attention to this important aspect of our life, it was opined! And then the session was concluded for the day.

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Second Day (25/2/2022)

On 25th, the second day of the chapter commenced with Br Mathew Paikada as the moderator. The discussion on the community and prayer life continued. In this session, discussions were held on the personal use of four wheelers, the problems related to their registration etc. The next point that came up for discussion was the status and future plan for the Ashrams in Vagamon Kattapana, Pathanamthitta etc. Various proposals were made and finally it was agreed upon to make use of these houses for the revitalization of our Franciscan Capuchin life; organizing different programs to provide the lay faithful a conducive place for their spiritual growth, as well as to make these facilities as a source of income for the brothers, as the external financial support is dwindling.

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The next item that was on the agenda was concerning the initial and ongoing formation of the brothers with a special emphasis on promoting the capuchin brotherhood. All the brothers are to promote earnestly the non-clerical form of our Capuchin life as this is an integral part of our common vocation. The capitulars were of opinion that the brothers in formation make their own choices to be a cleric or non-cleric. During the course of their formation, all will be provided the same opportunity for studies. Another point that emerged in the course of our discussion was the urgent need of the formation of the Formators. They need to be abreast with the modern trends in the spiritual and pastoral life of the church. For this, it is necessary to revisit our formation program in the various stages of formation at regular intervals.

In the afternoon session, which started at 2:30pm with the Br Simon Neelanirappel, as the moderator, the topic of mission was taken up. He requested our missionary brothers to present a brief report of their respective mission territories thus Br. Francis Nambiaparambil presented the report on behalf of PNG mission, Br. Renny Velayapallil on Nirmala Matha Custody, Br, Varghese Pulickiyil on Namibia mission, Br. Alexander Madathil on our collaboration with the German Province, Br. Sebin Njaralakkatt on our Italian collaboration and Br. Mathew Paikada on Syro-Malabar mission outside Kerala. Then the chapter dispersed for evening coffee.

Coming back after the tea-break the discussion continued on the mission, some of the important points that came up were : including the Hindi language study in our seminary curriculum; mission experience to be a part of our regency program; clerical brothers also to have mission experience at least for a period as mandatory part of their formation; refresher course for the brothers be made a regu-

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lar program of our ongoing information; sending brothers for higher training and study from the Mission territories as well; fostering of fraternal hospitality to our missionary brothers in the mother province; choosing the brothers for higher studies by carefully going through due consultations as suggested in our formation program; renewed collaboration with Vijananilayam in Andhra Pradesh, in studies as well as in teaching.

The next agenda point that the chapter took up was our ministry. The salient points of the discussion that came up can be summarized as follows; look into the feasibility of conducting "Franciscan retreats" when and where possible, similar to "Carceri retreats" in the Philippines; calling preferably Franciscans and Capuchins for our annual retreats; preparing the brothers and enabling them to prepare Franciscan retreats; the idea of Fratelli vicini be translated into concrete programs from time to time; utilizing the knowledge and life experience of the many brothers in the province who had higher studies in Franciscanism; looking into new and effective forms of vocation promotion; launching new forms of ministry, even in art and cultural fields, revisiting the forms and methods of our traditional ministries, like mission retreat, Secular Franciscan Order, etc. It was indeed very promising to witness the active participation of the capitulars in the discussion of the various topics that came up for discussion. But due to lack of time the discussions were to be curtailed often by the moderators at the disappointment of the participants. The second day of the Chapter, however, ended with a very positive note to the satisfaction of the Capitulars.

Third Day (26/2/2022)

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26th February, the third and final day of the chapter began at 9:30am. After the roll call by the chapter Secretary the first topic taken up for discussion from the agenda point namely administration was regarding the various issues related to the land at Thopramkudy. The Provincial gave a brief statement regarding the present situation and issues related to the land. Though some of the capitulars were not for a detailed discussion on the point, a short discussion was carried out and certain clarity was brought about on various issues involved.

The next item for discussion was "the vision and mission for each house". It was considered as one of the most important topic to be discussed, as it would throw light on our future life and ministry in the province. At the very outset, it was pointed out that we must plan our programs and projects with futuristic vision, good budgeting and economic planning so as to allocate funds for the projects in a judicious manner. The Purchase of land and the construction of ashrams should not be based on the availability of funds, but on clear vision of our charisma and the availability of suitable personnel for the proposed projects. Thus, this being a very important point, the suggestion of the moderator to postpone it for the next ordinary provincial chapter was not accepted.

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The capitulars were of opinion that it being important as well as an urgent one for that matter a commission could be constituted. Accordingly brothers Cherian Scaria, Joseph Puthenpurackal, Mathew Paikada, James Vazhacharickal and Sandeep Needissery were appointed as the Commission Members. The other points taken up for discussion were: the land in Gethsemany, Provincial infirmary, reconstruction and repair works in some houses, the newly acquired lands, cemetery extension at Assisi in Bharanganam.

Then the points which were not in the original agenda but added to it were taken up for discussion. These are the following: one brother one post and school of happiness initiated by Br. Mathew Karippal. Some time was given for discussing these points. During the course of the chapter proceedings two of our brothers namely, Br. Joseph Mathew and Br. Suresh Maroor were given a little time to introduce the books they authored.

Then the drafting committee presented the decisions and recommendations made in the chapter and they were accepted unanimously by the Capitulars with certain corrections. This was followed by the concelebrated Holy Eucharist and photo session. After the lunch the brothers departed for their respective ashrams, cherishing the sweet memories of the celebration of their fraternity!





Decisions, Recommendations, Exhortations

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- 1. The Chapter exhorts to the decisions of the Provincial Chapter 2017, that is: "Not to have private vehicles owned by individual friars. If any friar needs an exception, the request should go to the provincial council through the guardian. Regarding the use of the vehicles, friars shall follow the directives in the Ordinances of the General Chapter (No. 6/5)."
- 2. The Chapter decides to introduce a three days programme of prayer, recollection and renewal for friars in mixed age groups of minimum five, on a regular basis. The Chapter proposes the friaries of Vagamon, Kattappana, Thopramkudy, Rajakumari and Pathanamthitta for this purpose.
- 3. The Chapter decides it to be obligatory for all the friars who are to serve in formation houses, to participate in a Training Programme for formators.
- 4. The Chapter decides to introduce the Syro Malabar Holy Qurbana in Hindi and English languages to the brothers, from the very beginning stages of the formation, to promote missionary interest. In accordance with the Synodal decision we intend to promote Hindi language.
- 5. The Chapter decides that Provincial together with the councillors, do the needful to solve the land issue in Thopramkudy.
- 6. The Chapter constitutes a five member commission to envisage / to design / to work on the long term project exploring the vision and mission of the Province in view of the future 25 years. The members of the Commission are:
 - Br. Mathew Paikada
 - Br. Joseph Puthenpurackal
 - Br. Cherian Scaria
 - Br. James Vazhacharickal
 - Br. Sandeep Neendissery
- 7. The Chapter decides to entrust the building commission of the Province to do the needful for the renovation of the St. Thomas Ashram, Kavalam.
- 8. The Chapter decides to entrust with the Provincial building commission, the task of studying the feasibility of the cemetery extension at Bharananganam.

(Laverna Ashram, Vagamon)

It was only by chance that the idea of a house at Vagamon got evolved towards the end of the last triennium, when a plot of five acres of land was offered to us for a token amount, by Dr. Mrs. Mercy Murickan, elder sister of our Br Sebastian Thottumkal.

On 04-01-2017 this plot was registered in the name of St Joseph Province and Fr Sebastian Thottumkal was assigned to take care of the property. He started the construction work of the Ashram in 2019, staying in the outhouse owned by the Clarist Covvent at Vazhikkadavu, Vagamon. The foundation stone for the building was laid by Fr Joseph Puthenpurackal, the then provincial superior. Before the completion of the construction, as soon as the structure was habitable, Br Sebastian Thottumkal and Br Jose Vettickat started residing there from the 16th of April 2021.

The decision to shift the pre-noviate to elsewhere, caused shortage of friars to manage the cattle and poultry farms at Kattappana. Since the construction work at Vagamon was almost over, Br. Sebas-

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tian Thottumkal, a man of parts as all of us know, was taken to Portiumcula, Kattappana. His hard work and dedication in bringing up this house from nothing, is well remembered by everybody around.

In the month of September Br Kristudas Kurishummootil and Br Jomes Thekkemury joined our community. Though he wished very much to stick on here, due to ill health Br Kristudas had to move to Assisi, Bharananganam and he left in the month of March. During his short stay here he endeared himself to the few batches of German language students of Assisi Institute, who used to stay in a boarding close to our house.

The appearance and profile of the compound in our possession being very close to that of La Verna, Italy, the house was christened LAVERNA ASHRAM. The formal blessing of the house had to be postponed more than once, since the construction of the road to our premises was delayed due to prolonged adverse weather. Eventually the Ashram was blessed on 17th May 2022, by Mar Joseph Kallerangat, Bishop of Palai, in the presence of Br George Antony, Provincial Superior, who conducted the stepping-in ceremony prior to it.

Laverna Ashram, Vagamon envisages providing accommodation and facilities for individuals, families or small groups of laymen as well as for religious or priests who wish to spend some days in prayer and meditation.

Taking into account the need of the NE mission and the readiness of Br Jomes Thekkemury to render his service there, the provincial definitory relieved him from here on the 20th June and assigned him to Assam-Meghalaya mission. His hard work and proficiency in various fields was a great help to set up the new house and the premises. Laverna cherishes his selfless service with gratitude.

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

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The followings are some of the main events of the New Community of the NirmalaMatha Custody at Khermia.

The Start of the New mission in Dibrugarh Diocese

The Nirmala Matha Capuchin Custody, Assam –Meghalaya, spreads its wings to the Diocese of Dibrugarh, in the District of Jorhat between Rajabari and Mariani Parish, a place called Khermia. Land is spotted in Khermia village under Rajabari Parish in Jorhat district, in the Assam-Nagaland border. The Land was purchased



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from around 18 Adivasi and Assamese people who had stopped the rice cultivation in the highland paddy field due to the lack of consistent rain.

Br. Mathew Kallidukil, the previous Custos, during his last triennium, contacted Bishop Emeritus Joseph Aind SDB, the then Bishop of the Diocese of Dibrugarh, for the permission to open a new mission in Dibrugarh Diocese. Bishop Emeritus Joseph Aind SDB, gave us the written permission to open the house, hostel and the school. Fr. Mathew requested Bp Albert Hemrom to grant permission to open a parish in Khermia.

On 15 February 2021 Br. Simon Ekka came from Lamabari to Rajabari parish as Friar-in-charge to supervise the construction work of the new house. On 24 February he was provided with a motor bike as the work-site in Khermia was 18 kilometres away from Rajabari.

Construction of the House

The followings are the main events of the process of construction of the House at Khermia

- 1. On 16 March 2021 the foundation stone for the new house was laid by Fr. Sebastian Ekka, the then parish priest of Rajabari parish. The work continued with intermittent breaks due to the Covid Pandemic.
- 2. On 9 October 2021 Br. Francis reached Rajabari to help Br. Simon. On 13 Nov Br. Simon went to Mawjem for twenty days in the absence of Br. Paul.
- 3. On 6 December 2021 Brs. Francis and Simon moved to Mr. Dominic Oraon's house in Khermia. New bolero was given to the new mission.
- 4. On 4 January 2022 we shifted to the new house, though the work was still incomplete.
- 5. On 17 January Br. Covinshal came to help Br. Simon in the absence of Br. Francis who went for home holidays and treatment.
- 6. On 7 March 2022, it was decided that Khermia Centre can be declared as parish on 1 May 2022. Bp Albert asked us to visit the neighbouring Catholic villages with the permission of Rajabari and Mariani parish priests.
- 7. On 13 March 2022 Bp Albert Hemrom made his first visit to Khermia along with Emeritus Bp Joseph Aind and LebanusKujur, the Cancellor of Dibrugarh diocese.

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8. On 27 March Br. Renny made the First Canonical Visit to Khermia.

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- 9. Fr. Caesar, the parish priest, asked us to conduct the Holy Week programs in the proposed villages, especially in Tyroon and Hatipura. He asked us to do the House blessing. We had the Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday celebrations in Tyroon and Hatipura. Holy Thursday and Good Friday celebrations were held in Tyroon. Easter Vigil service was held in the Rajabari parish.
- 10. The first meeting of the Committee formed for the Inauguration of the Parish and Blessing of Capuchin House in Kermia and in that meeting decided to bless the houses in Tyroon on 7 April, in Khermia and Sonpur on 9 April, and in Hatipura on 11 April.
- 11. On 16 April, Fr. Caesar, during the Easter Vigil Mass, read the Letter of Declaration of the Erection of St. Alphonsa Parish in Khermia by Bp Albert Hemrom. Accordingly the new parish consists of four villages namely: Khermia, Tyroon, Sonpur and Hatipura. Khermia has 14 Catholic families, while Tyroon has 55, Sonpur has 9, and Hatipura has 45 families respectively.



Blessing and Declaration - 1 May 2022

The Committee for the Inauguration and Blessing of the Khermia parish decided to have common work on Holy Thursday (14 April) for cutting the bamboo and levelling the ground. The common work was held on 19, and from 24 to 30 April. To make approach road, 20 tractors of earth-filling was done. Intermittent rain and storm disrupted the work too. he villagers too were not free to come for the work, as some are 1 May 2022, Bp Albert Hemrom, Emeritus Bp

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Joseph Aind, around 30 priests and 20 sisters, and more than 2000 lay people from Rajabari and Woka parishes, and many Catholics, non-Catholics, and non-Christians participated in the programme and common meal. The programme started at 10 am with the reception of the Bishops, the Custos, the proposed parish priest and assistant parish priest. It was followed by the Inauguration of the Capuchin House Khermia by Fr. Renny our Custos by cutting the ribbon, and the blessing of the House by Emeritus Bishop Joseph Aind. The Solemn Holy Eucharistic Celebration was presided by Bp Albert Hemrom and Fr. LebanusKujur, the Chancellor of the Diocese, read the Declaration of the Erection of the Saint Alphonsa Parish, Khermia, and the appointment of Fr Francis and Fr Simon as the Parish priest and the Assistant parish priest respectively. Short felicitation program and common meal was held thereafter.



Socio-cultural and economic background

The Catholic Families in the four villages entrusted to our pastoral care belong to Adivasi family namely Munda, Oraon, Khadia etc. Generally they are tea garden workers. They go to their working place at 6 am and at 7.00 am begin their work and they work till 4.00 pm with one hour of lunch-break. They reach back home by 6 pm. Some are permanent workers appointed by the manager of the tea garden. They earn Rs. 205 per day and receive some ration rice,



atta and tea powder, no sugar, salt, cooking oil or kerosene. They are given free medical care for the common sicknesses. For any major sickness the workers are left to their destiny. Some work on daily wage who earn Rs 250 per day. But they have no fixed work. They do not get any ration rice or atta, or any medical help from the tea garden hospital. All the families who pay Rs 300 per month are given electricity connection from the Bagan. Most of them use cycle as the common means of transport. Some do not have cycle too.

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We wish and pray that with the help of God and the intercession of St. Francis of Assisi we as the community will help the people around to come up spiritually as well materially.



Marriage Course and Blessings

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Lamabari parish celebrated the marriage of 26 couples after the Marriage preparation course for two weeks. 52 young ones belonging to Bodo, Adivasi, Santali, Odiya and Munda tribes attended the course which started on 15th January 2022 and ended on 27th. Thus 26 new families were begun with the blessing of their marriages on 29th January. Let us bless these families who started the new life.

Lamabari Mission is fortunate to have a good school building for future of hundreds of the children of this area. We could do the concreting of its slab on 10th February. 2022.


Lenten pathways...

Br. Hadrian Vanchipurackal was born on 03 March 1934 at Kaipuzha in the present Kottayam diocese. He was born into the Vanchipurackal family as the son of Mr. Joseph and Mrs. Anna. He joined the Capuchins on 20th October 1955 and vested on 15 May 1956. He made his simple profession on 16 May 1957 and solemn profession on 16 May 1960.

The initial 9 years of his religious life were at our San Lorenzo da Brindisi International College, Rome as the assistant librarian where he had proved himself as an efficient and accurate chronologist. Completing his praiseworthy service at the International College, then major superiors sent him to Luzern in Switzerland for technical and mechanical studies. After securing a diploma in polytechnic he had returned to the province. An year later, in 1973 he was sent to our North Indian mission the present Krist Jyoti Province, where he has served the Order and the Province as an ex-



tra ordinary hard worker and an exemplary friar for long 12 years. Later on, again from 1989 to 2001 he was an active and committed missionary in our Andhra Orissa Mission the present Mary Matha Province of Andhra Pradesh, Telangana and Orissa.

Returning to the province in 2001 he was at our Portiuncula Ashram Kattappana where in too he was a friend indeed to our young men in the seminary and has shown best examples to them how a capuchin friar ought to be in the present world. The later years of his life that is from 2008 to until his flying back to his eternal origin he was a member at our Capuchin Provincialate, Kottayam.The con-friars and outsiders always appreciated his joel and noble presense inside and outside. The friars were calling him lovingly and affectionately "Baba" which was at the same time the manifestation of their appreciation and acceptance for him and the living manifestation of his great personality and fransiscan spirituality.

He had a special love, affection and devotion for St. Joseph who is also the patron of the province. Moreover, he was granted that favour to leave this world for his eternal reward on the same day of St. Joseph's "maranathirunnal"19th March 2022.

Br. Hadrian was a man of high spiritual ideologies and a very genuine person which helped him take up anything for Christ and his Kingdom. He was a man of excellent intellect especially in learning modern languages and in his ideas and ideologies he was post modern. His life was a role model to the younger generation, especially while he was at Kattappana, and Kottayam. He was ever ready to lend a helping hand in any area of the friary he was living from chapel to garden. He was an excellent gardener and an efficient cultivator wherever he lived. He was able to live his life very friendly with everyone and he was a friend of all whom he met on his journey of life. Though Br. Hadrian is with us no more, he lives in the hearts of all who have met him, as "Saipachan"both in Kerala and abroad.
