

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EDITORIAL

The most ancient hymn which narrates about the incarnation of Jesus is seen in the letter of St. Paul to Philippians: "Though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men." (Phil 2:6-7). He continues his letter writing about how he could practice this *Kenosis* in his life. He writes: "circumcised on the eighth day, of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew born of Hebrews; as to the law a Pharisee, as to zeal a persecutor of the church, as to righteousness under the law blameless. But whatever gain I had, I counted as loss for the sake of Christ, Indeed I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord." (Phil 3: 5-8). So Christmas is celebration of self emptying of Christ out of his love towards humanity. It is a call to renounce or redefine everything that hinders us from encountering the other human beings. It may be our positions, our wealth, our life styles etc. It is a new way of living our charism as Christians and religious by considering the least in the society. We can speak about helping the poor, needy and suffering while sitting in an armchair. But it is not the method which Jesus has shown us through his incarnation. If we really love the poor and marginalized, we should first be like them, get into their situation, put ourselves in others' shoes, then we will be able to see the things as they really experience. In order to save the humanity, a single word was enough for Jesus. But out of his love towards the suffering ones he

came as a man of suffering. Then he helped them to see the things with hope. This is the real message and theology of incarnation. There are many good examples of people who live this spirituality like St. Paul, St. Francis of Assisi, Mahatma Gandhi and so on. The sentence before the hymn in the letter to Philippians is this "Do nothing from selfishness or conceit, but in humility count others better than yourselves. Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others. Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus..." (Phil 2: 3-5) So Christmas is a call to open our eyes to the most disadvantaged ones and have solidarity with them.

Provincial's Message



"Babe of Bethlehem"

The question which is repeated from the beginning of humanity is what would be the reason or cause behind the incarnation of God. Many tried to answer it, but these answers were not sufficient to quench the thirst of the God-man St. Francis, he was in search of it. After meditating on the

paschal mystery of Christ he found out that his love for humanity made him share humanity with man. This is what the great Franciscan Theologian Blessed John Duns Scotus meant when he said that love and only love impelled God to create us and to incarnate. You can give without loving. But you cannot love without giving. This is the spirituality behind the incarnation of Jesus. It is easy for a man to give his possessions to others because there are possibilities to regain them. But Jesus speaks of a greater sharing that is of laying one's on of life to others. He says, "Greater love has no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends.."(Jn 15:17). It means giving oneself fully (Kenosis) without holding back is the greatest sign of love. It is what we see in the incarnation of Jesus. Even if a man doesn't sin, he would have become human. The only reason for the incarnation was God's pure love towards humanity.

In the days of St. Francis, the church more commonly practiced what theologians call a "High Christology", that is the Church emphasized the truth that Jesus is God, and King, Lord of all. Francis reclaimed the human qualities of Jesus in his life and spirituality, and considered the Incarnation as the "Feast of Feasts" because it demonstrated God's tremendous Humility, that Christ, truly God and King, would lower himself to be born of Mary, and further, to be born

lowly, in a manger. Francis believed that humility and poverty were the keys to become more Christ-like. Three years before his death, while visiting the hermitage in Greccio, Francis wished to celebrate Christmas with Profound Joy to commemorate his great love of the Incarnation. The chapel of the hermitage was too tiny to accommodate the large number of people he planned to invite to such a grand feast. Francis discovered a cave in the mountain's rocks and asked local inhabitants to build a manger scene, complete with hay and live animals, in the cave. Being in Bethlehem 1200 years ago was amazing experience for the viewers. The whole Bethlehem came down to Greccio. St. Francis preached about the Humility of God shown in the Incarnation (God become flesh in Jesus). Each time Francis attempted to say the name of Jesus, overcome by emotion, he could only whisper the "Babe of Bethlehem" instead. Thomas of Celano who recorded this story tells us, "This vision was not unfitting, for the Child Jesus had been forgotten in the hearts of many; but, by the working of his grace, he was brought to life again through his servant St. Francis." (cf. the First Life of St. Francis, 86.)

By making a crib in Greccio, St. Francis could bring back mystery of incarnation to the existential and religious vision from the ontological understanding of the Christ (Like nature, person, hypostatic union,) which were the matters of the hot discussion in previous centuries and which was far away from the common man's understanding of God. Ordinary people can easily understand a God who comes down from heaven and made flesh out of his love towards them. But it is difficult for them to understand a God which is explained in philosophical terms or categories. We too are called as Franciscans to incarnate Christ to others by our simple ways of dealings. God is not a complicated reality but simple as a child in manger.



Br. Tony who celebrated his last Holy Mass for our small community of Thekumatla on Sunday, 23rd Oct., as I was in Kerala. Whenever Br. Tony passed by Tekumatla, he used to visit Seva Sadan house and spent a little time with me, as I was often alone here. Whenever he saw me working in the garden, he used to join immediately before proceeding to his destination. Whenever he had some programme in the neighbouring parishes or centers he used to spend the overnight at Seva sadan Thekumatla. Br. Tony used to come over to Thekumatla to help me to conduct medical camps in the villages, conduct sports and games for the Children's Day celebration and the international day of youth and women. During the time of my COVID-19, I was at Chennur and everytime it was Br.Tony who used to bring food to my room and did all the assistance I needed in those fifteen days of my stay at Chennur. Br. Tony, you are always in my thoughts. Dear beloved brother Tony, may my prayer of thanks go with you and may you be in eternal joy of your Lord Jesus.

Br. Bijo was here at Thekumatla only for four months. During that time Br. Bijo used to be in Chennur for three days to teach in the school and the rest of the four days of the week he was at Thekumatla. Whenever there was any extra programme like independence day celebration, any feast celebration, Br. Bijo used to spend more days at Chennur. During the last four months he was a constant companion in the chapel, in the dining room, in the kitchen, in the garden. Br. Bijo takes utmost care to keep the house and surrounding clean and neat. When we visited other institutions and if he found some good garden plants, he used to get some plants for our garden. He used to tell me, do not get upset about the persons who show their egos. Br. Bijo used to tell me "I will not be here in the next year". Dear Brother, you must have meant that in the coming

academic year you would not be here. But your words like a prophet say that you are not here with me in the coming New Year 2023. The F.M.M Sisters of Godawarikhani were shocked and speechless when I called them to pray for you and Br. Tony. They remembered that you had visited them just a few days before you left us.

On 22nd morning, while I was having my breakfast at Laverna Ashram, Vagamon Brother called me and enquired about my health and told me to convey his greeting to the brothers there. I never thought that the call of yours is your last sharing with me. On the next day you are not there. Dear beloved Bro. Bijo I miss you very much. In your eternal joy keep me also in your heart..

THE REGENT SPEAKS...

Fraternal Greetings from Regency brothers...

We began the Regency program on 1st of June 2022. Br. Bijo Palampurackal and Br. Anup Puthenpurayil left for mission at Telangana and Chattisgarh respectively.

Initial Retreat

As a preparation for the regency program the other 12 brothers had a retreat at Konnakuzhy Ashram. Konnakuzhy Ashram offered us a favourable atmosphere to have a contemplative mood. There we could spend more time in prayer, reflection, reading and manual works. Br. Jose Edattukaran guided us into the depth of spirituality and true Franciscan way of life. He also emphasized the life of Christ and the need of attaining God-consciousness by developing one's own interiority. His sharing and cheerful comments helped us to have a new vision of life. The retreat was named 'IN CHRIST'. The very presence of Br. Jose Edattukaran, a simple man with great vigor and spirit, was a real challenge to us all, who was the guardian there.

On 5th June, after the retreat we moved to Akashaparavas, we had the program at different places. One group was at 'Pratyasa bhavan' Kannur, another at Kumily and Kattappana and another group at FOJ, Kurumal. We spent almost one month at these respective places taking care of marginalized section in our society.

Days in Attapadi

We next camped at Narasimukku Ashram, Attapadi from 30th June to 20th July. Our first mission was planting trees in the reserve forest at Chemmannur part of the Silent Valley, where we planted about thousands of trees as part of the 'Vanamahotsav'. From 5th July to 8th, we had the classes on the Capuchin Constitution by Fr.Wilson Kodungakaran. We had an invitation from Goolikadavu Parish to take up a youth program for nearly 100 students and young people. We could do a marvelous program over there. We had our monthly collection on 11th July and which was led by one of the fathers from the Rogationanist congregation. On the 11th July, Fr Pauly Madassery, Provincial of St. Thomas province had made a fraternal visit to us and he met every one of us and senior friars in the Narasimukku Ahram.

From July 12th to 17th were interesting days for us, we spent our days at Chittoor Parish, Attapadi. Our aim was to have an exposure to Adivasi people and their hamlets. We had an initial class from one of the community organisers and the rest of the days our plan was to have a good contact with the Adivasi people, but unfortunatly those days it was raining cats and dogs. And due to it, our program got changed and we could do little to be with the Adivasis. Our programs in Chittoor Parish concluded on 17th and on the last day we could conduct a one-day program for catechism students of the parish. We organised and conducted it well. Children made their valuable remarks about the classes and it was a good time for us to check our capacity in conducting one day programs including music, classes, inspirational talks,etc. The parish priest had recognised our efforts and he had made good remarks about the program. Our last program in Attappadi was visiting Aadi, a center aimed at helping the Adivasis which is run by Jesuit fathers on 18th of the same month.

Time to study: IGNOU Exams

We had our Degree exams between July 7th to August 27th. For which all of the brothers from the three provinces went to their respective provinces for exam preparation.

Br. Pradeep, had gone for Counsellors Training Program at Dindigul at the same time as he had already done his degrees. We had participated in the *Vizhinjam samaram* in solidarity with the fisher folk, it was organized under the banner of JPIC. Friars from different places gathered at Kodappanakunnu Ashram, Trivandrum. By 9:30, we reached at samara pantal and we found hundreds of people from different places who stood in solidarity with fisher folk.

Navajeevan Trust

One of the most awaited programs was at the Navajeevan Trust, which was held between 28 August to 7th September. The life experience of P. U. Thomas chettan really enriched us. We could participate in the services Navjeevan trust had been offering for years, such as *Kanjivitharanam* in the hospital premises, taking care of the destitute and the differently abled people and serving as a bystander in the Kottayam Medical College who doesn't have a bystander. Those were the times to feel the pain of poor people who have nobody to take care. The situation reminded us of the Gospel passage: You clothed me, when I was naked and you visited me when I was in the sick bed. During those days sister sickness had made a visit to some of our brothers, but everybody recovered soon.

Sehion Preshitha Sangam, Edakochi

The days with Judeson chetan and Preshitha sangam were one of the most memorable days in Regency, the program was held from 7th to 21st of September. Karunya yathra was an awesome program for us, it started on 8th of September on the Onam day and the program was flagged off by the bishop of Kochi Diocese. The main focus of Karunyathra was to go through the 14 districts of Kerala. We met the destitute, differently abled in the streets and

gave them bath, good dresses and Onasadhya. There were people who had not taken a bath for long and who were not able to have their daily meals, the program lasted for 2 weeks. The program was really worthy and we were enriched with lots of memorable experiences. We also participated in *podichoru* distribution, which he has been doing for 1500 people daily for the past 25 years.

Street play at Kannur

We were curious and excited about the street play to be done by ourselves. And so we encouraged each other and prepared for this adventure. Our guide was Fr. Scaria Kalloor. The program lasted from 21st September to 15th October. Mr. Rajesh Manathana was director of our street drama. The major theme of the play was against the use of drugs. And with the help of Mr Rajesh Manathana, we could perform the play in many schools, colleges, and bus stations and was able to perform the drama in more than 40 occasions. In addition to Street drama, Fr. Scaria gave us a class on JPIC. We had a golden opportunity to work with Fr. Scaria at Chavassery, where he conducted a peace conference in a riot affected area.

We had our Regency evaluation meeting in the Pavanatma provincialate at Melechowa. In preparation for the St. Francis' feast we had our confession as well as monthly recollection on 3rd October, and celebrated the feast at the provincialate. On 3rd October along with services of transitus, we, Regency Brothers, recreated the transitus in the parish chapel through a drama.

Vocation Drive



at Shreyas office, and on next days we were able to visit Adivasi colonies, Water shed programs. on 16 November, we could organize a Sports Day for parents in Adivasi colonies followed by a Medical camp and on 19th, a grand Sports Day was organized for the tribal kids residing in Bathery unit consisting of 250 kids from of 14 colonies. It was a grand success and in the evening we concluded our program at Bathery and took a bus to Muvattupuzha.

Grace of work...

On Nov 20 we reached Loreto Ashram, Muvattupuzha and had our breakfast and left for our next mission at Muthalakodam, Thodupuzha to experience the sweat and toil of manual labour. We reached our destination on the same day and cleansed our new home and by evening our home was blessed by Vicar of Muthalakodam Forane. On 22nd November onwards our brothers started going for different works and still continue to do it with lots of vigour and enthusiasm.

BR. TONY SIMON PULLADAN

Br. Tony Simon Pulladan was born on March 10, 1991 at Kaipuzha, in the Archdiocese of Kottayam, as the son of P.T. Simon and Mariamma Simon. He was the second of the four children. He joined the Capuchins in 2006 at Seraphic Seminary Bharananganam. Br. Tony was vested on May 14, 2010 and made his religious commitment on May 15, 2011. He began his studies in theology at Sacred Heart Theological College in Shillong and finished at Capuchin Vidyabhavan in Thellakom. On November 18, 2019, he was ordained as a priest. After his ordination, Br. Tony gained pastoral experience by working at St. Thomas Church Kallara. Br. Tony is a polite and ostensibly quiet individual. He was observed devoting more time to personal prayer. He was gifted with exceptional musical abilities and could play the flute, violin, tabla, keyboard, and many other instruments. He particularly cared for the underprivileged

and the disadvantaged. He was a kind, generous, and sociable man. His dedication to the Franciscan way of life was evident in his simple way of living. After his six months of experience in the parish, he was sent to the Syro-Malabar Mission in Telengana. He was a good missionary who could attract people to Jesus using his musical talents. He was teaching at the Assisi School in Chennur. He was helping Bp. Prince Panengaden, the Bishop of Adilabad, in retreat preaching with his musical ministry. Br. Tony Pullattukalayil and Br. Bijo Palampurackal, while taking a bath in the Godavari river, got drowned on October 23, 2022, near Chennur, Telangana. Br. Tony was trying to save Br. Bijo, who lost control in the deep waters, but both of them drowned. Br. Tony's body was discovered five days later, three kilometres from the place of the accident. His funeral was conducted on October 30, 2022, and his body was laid to rest in the vault of Capuchin Vidyabhavan Thellakom.



BR. BIJO PALAMPURACKAL

Br. Bijo Palampurackal, born on August 24, 1984, at Kanakary in Pala diocese as the only son of Thomas P. T and Gracy Thomas, later settled down at Mallappally in Chaganassery Archdiocese. After taking his graduation in India, he left for the United Kingdom to study MBA, where his elder sister was working. From there, he made a pilgrimage to Lourde, where he got inspiration to follow Jesus in the footsteps of St. Francis of Assisi. With the permission of his parents, after completing his studies, he joined Seraphic Seminary Bharananganam on June 2016. He was vested on May 14, 2018 and made his religious commitment on May 15, 2019. As a promising young friar, he manifested his love for his Capuchin vocation by being faithful to the demands of the commitment he made to the

Lord. He possessed deep convictions about life and was quite interested in Capuchin life. He was responsible and intelligent. He was a sensible, thoughtful man. He was fully convinced of his vocation. He had a kind, compassionate disposition and was always willing to help others. His appreciation for Franciscan values was notable. He was a gracious host and an outstanding cook. During his regency, he opted to go to our Missions in Telengana State. On weekdays, he was teaching at Assisi School, Chennur, and at weekends, he used to go to Seva Sadan, Thekumatla. He was very much loved by his students there. While taking bath in River Godavari on October 23, 2022, about 06.10 pm in Errayipet village (Parepally), approximately 12 km from Chennur, Br. Bijo was caught up in an undercurrent and was drowned. Despite all attempts to save him, he was carried away by the strong current. In the attempt to save him, Fr. Tony Pullattukalayil also drowned in the deep waters. On the next day, Br. Bijo's body was recovered from the nearby region. On October 28, the funeral took place, and his body was interred in the vault of the Capuchin Vidyabhavan at Thellakom.
